
AUTHOR TALK WITH TOM SCHALATA

THE BLOODY BUCKET: PENNSYLVANIA'S 28TH DIVISION SATURDAY, JULY 23 AT 10:00 A.M.

The Library is very proud to welcome author Tom Schlata (retired newspaper executive living right here in Stevens) to discuss his latest book, *The Bloody Bucket*, which chronicles his grandfather's military service in Pennsylvania's 28th Division in World War I. Based largely on actual events, this work of historical fiction covers the period of 1916-1918. It traces his grandfather's civilian life working for Baldwin Locomotive Works and his military training before serving in France and Belgium.

The Bloody Bucket appeals to a wide range of interests: World War I and military scholars, people of Polish heritage, railroad buffs, sports enthusiasts, and those interested in Philadelphia History.


TECHNOLOGY TUTORING


