

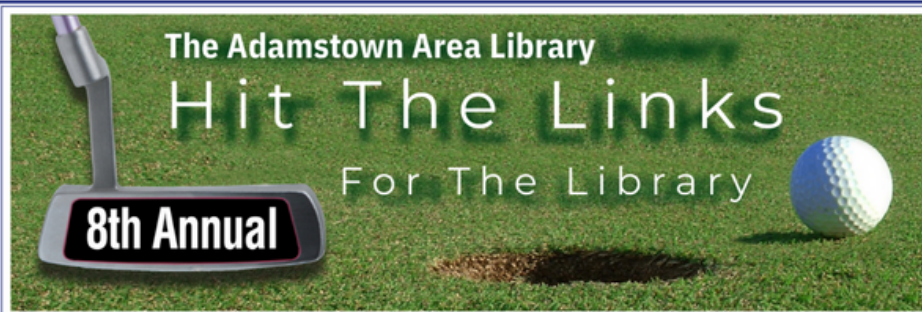

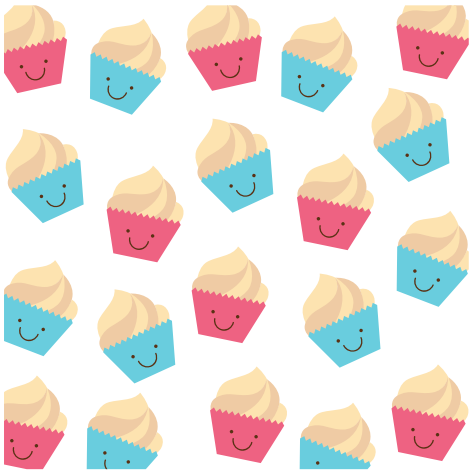

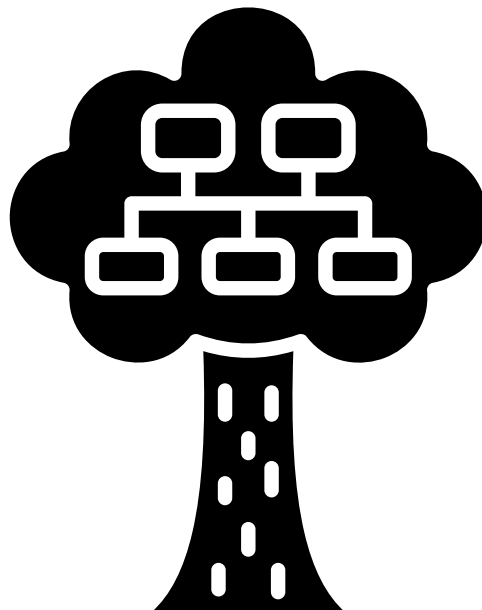
### DROP-IN STEM @ THE LIBRARY (2:00 - 5:00 PM)
