



## READ (OR SING!) ALONG TO YOUR FAVORITE BOOK!



## OCTOBER'S BANNED BOOK: THE SANDMAN BY NEIL GAIMAN

Cited in 2010 as one of the ALA's most frequently banned or challenged graphic novels.

"One of seven siblings who represent various states of consciousness--Destiny, Death, Destruction, Desire, Despair, Dream and Delirium--Morpheus is head of the allegorical family called the Endless. [...] this collection presents some powerful writing about, and memorable images of, the other reality wherein we while away a third of our lives."
