FEBRUARY'S BANNED BOOK: THE HATE U GIVE BY ANGIE THOMAS



"Angie Thomas' YA phenomenon [...] has been facing pushback from school districts ever since it was published. The novel centers on Starr Carter, a teenage girl who lives between two worlds: the predominantly black community she and her family live in, and the predominantly white high school she attends. When her friend, unarmed, is killed senselessly by a police officer, she rises as an activist and asserts pride in her black identity." -




